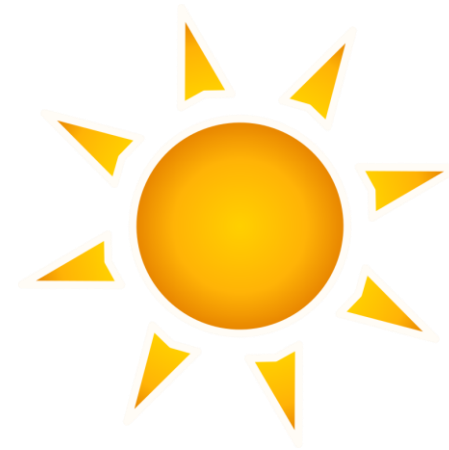

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Terms and conditions

The service is free to use by children, young people and families. It is a play project not a childcare service.

Participants must register to attend

If your child cannot attend a pre-booked session please notify us asap, so the place can be offered to another child.

Allocation of sessions at the Summer of Play will be notified to main carer in advance of the session.

Lunch and refreshments will be provided for free. You must specify any dietary requirements or needs.

Unless stated children will not be permitted to leave the premises without an appropriate adult.

Activities may be altered at short notice.

Parents can be asked to support their child/ren within the session if they are unsettled and need increased support.

It is imperative to share information relating to your child that may be helpful to support positive engagement within the session.

Your child's safety and wellbeing is paramount to us. Information provided will be shared with appropriate agencies if necessary

Data information will be collected and shared with our funders and Young Lambeth Cooperative.

A full copy of LCC policy and procedures is available to view on site.

Registration process

All children must complete the registration and booking forms to register their interest in the summer of play sessions.

Registration will take place from 12th July 2019.

To secure your child's place, book early as places are limited.

Drop in or email us for a registration and booking form.

Bookings will be confirmed 19th July 19

There will be a limited number of walk in places available each day. It is best to call us before dropping into the session. Drop in's are on a first come first serve basis and participants will be required to complete a registration form prior to entry.

Adventure Playground (APG)

- For children and young people 8 – 13 yrs.
- Children can access the service without a gurdian, staff may request a gurdian is required to support a child settle into the environment.
- Parents of children 8 – 10 yrs must be collected by a named carer by 3.30pm unless alternative arrangements have been agreed in advance by the main carer with the manager

One O'clock Club (OCC)

- Children and infants 0 – 7 yrs
- Parents must attend the sessions with their children
- Older children 5-7 yrs within the OCC will be encouraged and supported to participate in the APG activities whilst parents are onsite.
